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# ABOUT THIS REPORT

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## IN THIS REPORT

This report contains a summary of crime statistics for York Regional Police pertaining to incidents reported between January 1<sup>st</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2002. A one year and five year comparison is made. Miscellaneous statistics are also included.

## HOW ARE CRIMES COUNTED?

The data in this report is based on accumulated to-date information. Therefore, the number of violations recorded may change due to late reporting, reclassification, and unfounded incidents.

York Regional Police publish crime statistics based on the number of reported violations (Incident-based Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)). Incident-based UCR classifies incidents according to the four most serious violations in the incident (generally the violations which carry the longest maximum sentences under the *Criminal Code of Canada*). Violent incidents (except robbery) are classified differently from other types of crime. For violent crime, a separate incident is recorded for each victim. Robbery, however is counted as if it were a non-violent crime in order to avoid inflating the number of incidents. In categorizing incidents, violent violations always take precedence over non-violent violations.

## MAKING COMPARISONS

All statistics in this report are compiled from Incident-based reporting. These statistics should not be compared with those provided by *Statistics Canada* who converts the data received to an Aggregate-based UCR format which measures only the most serious offence related to an incident. In addition, *Statistics Canada* include the number of offences reported by the Toronto North Detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police with York Regional Police's crime statistics.

*Statistics Canada* data should be used for comparisons between policing jurisdictions because all data is converted to Aggregate-based reporting.

## TERMINOLOGY

**Actual** totals include only those incidents for which an occurrence report was made and have been substantiated through police investigation.

**Clearance rates** are calculated by the number of violations cleared by charge or otherwise (persons processed by other means) divided by the number of violations. These violations may not necessarily have occurred during the reporting period but some time prior.

**Crime rates** are expressed as a rate per 100,000 population using mid-year population estimates

supplied by York Region Planning and Development Services Department and have been rounded to two decimals.

**Criminal incident** refers to a set of connected events which usually constitute an occurrence report. One incident can include more than one violation.

**Offence** is defined as a statistical fact for Aggregate-based reporting. This terminology is not used in Incident-based reporting.

**Violation** refers to a contravention of the *Criminal Code, Federal, or Provincial Statutes*.

**Young Offender** refers to a person aged 12 - 17 years inclusive.

**Youth** refers to a person under the age of 18 years.

**Youth crime** refers to the number of youths charged or processed by other means.

## **TYPES OF VIOLATIONS: INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING**

**Crimes Against Persons** are crimes involving aggressive action (with the intent to do harm) or threat of such action by one person against another. These include violations causing death, attempt capital crime, sexual assault, assault, robbery and other violent violations, and violations/deprivation of freedom.

**Violations Causing Death** include murder 1<sup>st</sup> degree, murder 2<sup>nd</sup> degree, manslaughter, infanticide, criminal negligence cause death, and other related offences causing death.

**Attempt Capital Crime** violations include attempted murder and conspiracy to commit murder.

**Sexual Assault** violations include aggravated sexual assault, sexual assault with a weapon or cause bodily harm, sexual assault, and other sexual crimes.

**Assault** violations include aggravated assault, assault with a weapon or cause bodily harm, assault, unlawfully cause bodily harm, discharge firearm with intent, assault peace/public officer, criminal negligence cause bodily harm, and other assaults.

**Robbery and Other Violent Violations** include robbery, extortion, criminal harassment, uttering threats, explosives causing death/bodily harm, arson disregard for human life, and other violent violations.

**Violations/Deprivation of Freedom** include kidnapping (forcible confinement), hostage taking, and abduction.

**Crimes Against Property** involve unlawful acts with respect to property but do not involve the use or threat of violence against an individual. These include arson, break and enter, theft, have stolen goods, fraud, and mischief.

**Drug** violations include violations under the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* and the *Food and Drug Act*. These violations are comprised of possession, trafficking, importation or production of various illicit controlled and restricted drugs, and proceeds of crime.

**Weapons** violations include violations under the *Criminal Code* which involve any thing used, designed to be used or intended for use in causing death or injury to any person or used for the purpose of threatening or intimidating any person. These include possession, use, trafficking, pointing, unauthorized import/export, firearms documentation and administration, and unsafe storage.

**Public Morals** violations include prostitution, indecent acts, production/distribution of child pornography, gaming and betting, and public morals.

**Other Criminal Code** violations include the remaining non-traffic *Criminal Code* violations that are classified as neither violent nor property violations. These violations are divided into two parts:

Part A: includes bail violations, counterfeiting currency, disturb the peace, escape custody, obstruct, unlawfully at large, trespass at night, fail to appear, breach of probation, and threatening/harassing telephone calls.

Part B: includes offences against public order, offences against administration of law and justice, invasion of privacy, offences against the person and reputation, offences against the rights or property, fraudulent transactions/contracts and trade, wilful/forbidden acts/respect of certain property, offences related to currency, proceeds of crime, attempts/conspiracies/accessories, and all other criminal code.

**Federal Statutes** violations include violations under all other federal statutes. They include the *Bankruptcy Act*, *Customs Act*, *Excise Act*, *Immigration Act*, and the *Young Offenders Act*.

**Traffic** violations include all traffic violations under the *Criminal Code*. These include dangerous operation, impaired related violations, and other criminal traffic violations.

**Other Criminal Traffic** violations include fail to stop or remain and drive while prohibited.

## **TYPES OF VIOLATIONS: AGGREGATE-BASED REPORTING**

**Crimes of Violence** are crimes involving the use of aggressive action (with the intent to do harm) or threat of such action by one person against another. These include homicide, attempted murder, assault, other sexual offences, abduction, and robbery.

**Homicide** offences include murder 1<sup>st</sup> degree, murder 2<sup>nd</sup> degree, manslaughter, and infanticide.

**Assault** offences include sexual assault, sexual assault with a weapon or cause bodily harm, aggravated sexual assault, assault, assault with a weapon or cause bodily harm, aggravated

assault, unlawfully cause bodily harm, discharge firearm with intent, assault police, assault other peace/public officer, and other assaults.

**Abduction** include abduction of person under 14, abduction of person under 16, abduction contrary to custody order, and abduction no custody order.

**Property Crimes** involve unlawful acts with respect to property but do not involve the use or threat of violence against an individual. These include break and enter, theft of motor vehicle, theft over \$5000, theft \$5000 and under, have stolen goods, and fraud.

**Other Criminal Code** offences include the remaining non-traffic *Criminal Code* violations that are classified as neither violent nor property violations. These include arson, bail violations, counterfeit currency, disturb the peace, escape custody, indecent acts, kidnapping, public morals, obstruct police/peace officer, unlawfully at large, trespass at night, mischief, and other criminal code offences.

**Other Crimes** include prostitution, gaming and betting, offensive weapons, and other criminal code offences.

**Drug** offences include offences under the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* . These are comprised of possession, trafficking, and importation or production of various illicit controlled and restricted drugs.

**Other Federal Statutes** include offences under all other federal statutes. They include the *Bankruptcy Act, Canada Shipping Act ,Customs Act, Excise Act, Immigration Act, Young Offenders Act,* and the *Firearm Act*.

## CHANGES IN REPORTING METHODOLOGY

In January 1998, *Statistics Canada* made changes to the reporting methodology of Incident-based reporting. This included the addition of several new violations, uttering threats to person, proceeds of crime (*Criminal Code*), proceeds of crime (*Controlled Drug and Substance Act*), other violations causing death/bodily harm, removal of children from Canada, prostitution under 18 - living off the avails, prostitution under 18 - procuring, and production/distribution of child pornography. One of these violations, utter threats to person, had previously been included in the other criminal code violations category. This new violation is now included in the robbery and other violent violations category. This should be taken into consideration when making five year comparisons of robbery and other violent violations, crimes against persons, and other criminal code data.

In March 2000, new criminal code sections pertaining to evade police were passed into law. To correspond with this, *Statistics Canada* implemented new violation codes relating to these criminal code sections. These violation codes fall under the dangerous operation category. This must be considered when making five year comparisons of criminal code traffic violations.

On January 1, 2002, a change was implemented to include motor vehicle collisions when a party

left the scene of the accident, but was not apprehended, as a criminal code violation. This only includes collisions which constitute an offence contrary to the *Criminal Code*. This change of reporting methodology is in accordance with other police services' practices.

A review of the way York Regional Police deploy its front-line resources began in 1999. A more comprehensive study was undertaken in 2000. The *Restructuring Front-Line Service Delivery Study* with recommendations was submitted to the Police Services Board and given approval in October 2001. One of the recommendations in the study was to re-align the district and beat boundaries. The purpose of changing the geographic beat locations was to distribute workload levels more efficiently between reactive, administrative, and proactive duties. The changes in beat boundaries also allow for a more effective response to emergency calls for service and enables ownership of an area by patrol units. On March 3, 2002, the changes to the district boundaries were implemented. Although this does not impact regional statistics, it must be considered when comparing district statistics from 2001 and 2002.

The delivery of 9-1-1 service to the residents of York Region began in 1994 with a Bell Canada operator in Ottawa answering all calls to 9-1-1 from within York Region. The calls would then be transferred to an appropriate emergency response agency within York Region. In April 2001, an application was made by Bell Canada to the Canadian Radio and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) to withdraw this service. In June 2001, Regional Council authorized Regional staff to directly provide 9-1-1 emergency in conjunction with York Regional Police. On April 2, 2002, 9-1-1 call answering was transferred to York Region from Bell Canada with York Regional Police as the first point of reception for 9-1-1 calls.

The data presented is for the year of 2001 as crime data for 2002 is not available at the time of this report.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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- **6,853 CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS** (violent crime) violations were reported between January 1<sup>st</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2002 compared to 6,825 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 28 violations or 0.4%. The violent crime rate per 100,000 population for the year of 2002 was 838.43 compared to 884.50 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents a decrease of 5.2%.
- **13 VIOLATIONS CAUSING DEATH** were reported in 2002 compared to 9 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 4 violations or 44.4%. Based on the rate of Violations Causing Death per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 36.4%.
- **6 ATTEMPT CAPITAL CRIME** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 15 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents a decrease of 9 violations or 60.0%. Based on the rate of Attempt Capital Crime violations per 100,000 population, there has been a decrease of 62.2%.
- **428 SEXUAL ASSAULT** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 419 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 9 violations or 2.1%. Based on the rate of Sexual Assault violations per 100,000 population, there has been a decrease of 3.6%.
- **3,802 ASSAULT** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 3,736 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 66 violations or 1.8%. Based on the rate of Assault violations per 100,000 population, there has been a decrease of 3.9%.
- **351 ROBBERY** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 386 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents a decrease of 35 violations or 9.1%. Based on the rate of Robbery violations per 100,000 population, there has been a decrease of 14.2%. The majority of the robbery violations occurred in District 5 (31.6%) and District 2 (31.3%) and most frequently on Friday (18.5%) and between the evening hours of 6:00p.m. and 11:59p.m. (45.9%). Carjacking incidents represent 4.8% of the total Robbery violations while home invasions represent 3.4%. Street related robberies during this period represent 67.8% of the total Robbery violations.
- **28,091 CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 25,572 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 2,519 violations or 9.9%. Based on the rate of Crimes Against Property violations per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 3.7%.
- **4,880 OTHER CRIMINAL CODE** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 3,441 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 1,439 violations or 41.8%. Based on the rate of Other Criminal Code violations per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 33.9%.
- **1,861 DRUG** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 1,442 during the

corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 419 violations or 29.1%. Based on the rate of Drug violations per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 21.8%.

- 42,653 **CRIMINAL CODE** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 38,180 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 4,473 violations or 11.7%. Based on the rate of Criminal Code violations per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 5.5%.
- 3,697 **CRIMINAL CODE TRAFFIC** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 1,406 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 2,291 violations or 162.9%. Based on the rate of Traffic violations per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 148.2%. In January 2002, criminal code fail to remain motor vehicle collisions not involving charges were included in the total criminal code traffic violations. This change of reporting is attributed to the increase. If the 2002 total is adjusted to reflect the total had a change of reporting not occurred, the one year increase would be 0.1% and the rate of Traffic violations actually decreased in 2002 by 5.5%.
- 922 **IMPAIRED OPERATION/RELATED VIOLATIONS** were reported in 2002 compared to 964 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents a decrease of 42 violations or 4.4%. Based on the rate of Impaired Operation/Related Violations per 100,000 population, there has been a decrease of 9.7%.
- 305 **DANGEROUS OPERATION** violations were reported in 2002 compared to 286 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 19 violations or 6.6%. Based on the rate of Dangerous Operation violations per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 0.7%.
- 18,239 **MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION REPORTS** were processed in 2002 compared to 17,900 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 339 reports or 1.9%. Based on the rate of motor vehicle collision reports per 100,000 population, there has been a decrease of 3.8%.
- 49 **PERSONS DIED** on our roadways in 2002 compared to 29 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 20 persons or 69.9%. The year of 2002 saw the highest number of fatal collisions and persons killed during the corresponding period of the past five years.
- 87,871 **PERSONS WERE CHARGED** with criminal and non-criminal offences in 2002 compared to 92,657 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents a decrease of 4,786 persons charged or 5.2%. Young Offenders represent 13.5% of the charged persons during this period in 2002 compared to 13.4% in 2001.
- The **CLEARANCE RATE** for Violent Crime in 2002 increased to 71.2% from 69.7% during the corresponding period in 2001. The clearance rate for Property Crime increased slightly to 27.0% in 2002 from 26.4% in 2001. The clearance rate for Criminal Code violations remained unchanged in 2002 compared to 2001 (41.5%).

- 242,278 **DEMANDS FOR SERVICE** were received in 2002 compared to 174,611 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 67,667 demands or 38.8%. Based on the rate of demands for service per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 31.0%. In April 2002, responsibility for answering 9-1-1 calls was transferred from Bell Canada to York Region. The increase can be attributed to this. The adjusted total of Demands for Service, not including silent 911 calls, increased 11.3% in 2002 from 2001.
- **YOUTH CRIME** in York Region decreased 3.4% in 2002 compared to the corresponding period in 2001. Charges laid against Young Offenders decreased 4.6% while the number of youths processed by other means have increased 5.9%.
- 2,472 **VEHICLES WERE REPORTED STOLEN** during 2002 compared to 2,253 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 219 vehicles or 9.7%. Based on the rate of stolen vehicles per 100,000 population, there has been an increase of 3.6%. Automobiles represent 52.1% of the vehicles stolen with Honda being the most common make (28.2%). Dodge (19.8%) and Ford (17.5%) were the most frequent makes of trucks stolen. The district which reported the majority of the vehicles stolen was District 4 (38.0%).
- During 2002, the **RECORDS & F.O.I. BUREAU** processed 7,977 requests for motor vehicle collision/incident summary reports compared to 9,600 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents a decrease of 1,623 requests or 16.9%. This decrease can be attributed to a backlog of processing motor vehicle collision reports in the Bureau. In 2002, 11,539 court documents were processed compared to 10,703 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 836 documents or 7.8%.
- In 2002, 1,039 **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION** requests were received compared to 814 during the corresponding period in 2001. This represents an increase of 225 requests or 27.6%. Formal requests increased 80.8% (52 to 94) and informal requests have increased 24.0% (762 to 945).
- The **ALARM PROGRAM** saw a 19.7% increase in registrations (65,804 to 78,769). The number of false alarms continues to be problematic with 98.5% of the calls being false, which was slightly increased from 98.3% in 2001.
- Reports taken by **CRIME STOPPERS** increased to 780 in 2002 compared to 600 in 2001. This represents an increase of 30.0%. Although arrests made as a result of a crime stoppers tip decreased 12.4%, cases cleared increased 21.3% and charges laid increased 7.7%.
- The **VICTIM CRISIS ASSISTANCE & REFERRAL SERVICE PROGRAM (VICARS)** saw an increase in both on-scene occurrences (5.1%) and the number of telephone crisis calls/office visits (17.5%). The allocation of service showed a reverse trend between male and female clients in 2002 compared to 2001. In 2002, females represented 34.3% of the total clients served while in 2001 they represented 73.3%. In 2002, males represented 65.7% of the clients served while in 2001 they represented 26.7%.

- all Violent Crime categories saw an increase above the five year average except Attempt Capital Crime.

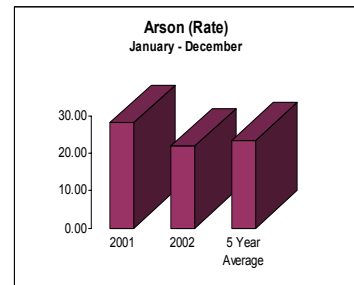
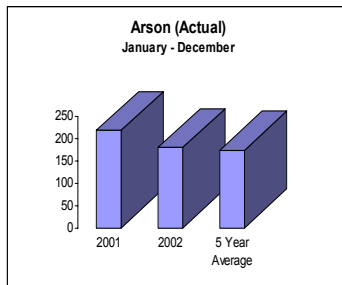
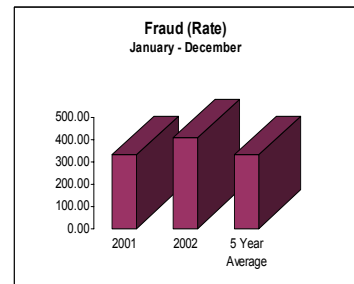
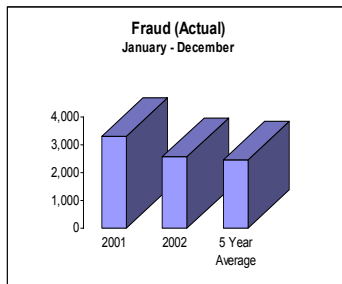
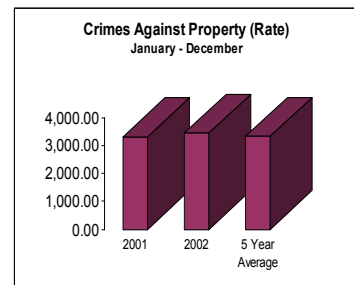
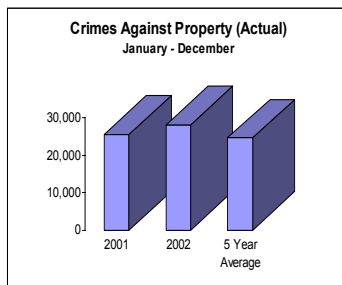
